



GOODWILL DONATES A PIECE OF THE HADDONFIELD SHELLFISH COMPANY HISTORY TO LOCAL RESIDENT

Maple Shade, NJ -- (January 16, 2013) – Every day, Haddonfield resident Michele Bertett walks her kids to school down Grove Street. One day, she noticed the Haddonfield Shellfish Company building had been sold and the new owner, Goodwill Industries of Southern NJ & Philadelphia, had begun construction. Having lived in Haddonfield for 40 years, she and her family had many fond memories of the old fish market. Her father, Haddonfield resident Lou Frontino, had mentioned how neat it would be to have a sign from the fish market. So, Bertett wrote a letter to Goodwill asking if by chance they could have the signs. She taped it to the front door--hoping it would reach the right person. The letter made its way to Goodwill Chief Operating Officer Michael Shaw at the nonprofit's Maple Shade headquarters. He immediately asked construction workers to put aside the Haddonfield Shellfish Company signs for Bertett and her father. Coincidentally, another local resident approached Shaw just a couple of weeks *after* Bertett asking for the signs.

In the end, the nostalgic Haddonfield Shellfish Company signs will go down in history albeit a little bit south of here. A fisherman at heart, Frontino, eventually plans to move to Delaware, where he will post the signs on his backyard fishing shack on the water.

"Goodwill was happy to accommodate Ms. Bertett's request," said Goodwill Chief Operating Officer Michael Shaw. "In our business, we rely on donations from area residents to stay afloat so we were pleased to be able to reciprocate in this situation and give the Bertett/Frontino families a bit of Haddonfield history. The signage will certainly be a conversation piece once it makes its way down to Delaware," he added.

Goodwill's Donation Center, located at 170 Grove Street in Haddonfield, opened in October 2012. The Center encourages donations of gently-used items including clothing, accessories, linens, toys, books, household items, furniture and much more. It is staffed by a courteous donation services attendant and equipped with a state-of-the-art kiosk system for generating receipts for tax purpose. The mass collection and resale of donated items in Goodwill's 21 local retail stores fund job

training programs and career services that help individuals with disabilities and disadvantages get to work.
